Earn continuing education unit (CEU) credits with correspondence courses...



Pharmacology (10 CEU credits)

The large number of drugs used in veterinary medicine places significant responsibility on all those involved. This course will help students gain some understanding of the various drugs available in veterinary medicine, how they work, and what they are used for. The correct and safe selection, handling and administration of veterinary drugs can ensure the humane treatment of the creatures in our care, as well as our own health and safety and that of clients in the workplace.

Advanced Anaesthesia & Pain Management Techniques (5 CEU credits)

This course examines the reasons anaesthetic emergencies occur, their prevention, and how to resolve anaesthetic problems in small animal practices. Topics include human errors and how to avoid them, correct response to anaesthetic complications, and hazards of commonly used pre-anaesthetics and anaesthetic agents. Co-ordination of clinical staff, crash kits and emergency drugs are also discussed.

Introduction to Small Animal Dentistry (10 CEU credits)

This course examines canine and feline dentistry and the technician's role in providing good dental care. Topics include anatomy, the complete oral exam, dental radiography, dental equipment, safety measures, oral disease, steps of a complete dental prophylaxis and home care. Sharpening of instruments is also briefly discussed.

Introduction to Small Animal Behaviour (5 CEU credits)

This course examines domestic canine and feline behavior. It investigates how and why these species behave in a certain manner. Topics include; how each species learns, developmental behaviours, social systems, communication, common canine and feline behaviour, and how to prevent behaviour problems. Treatment options are also discussed.

Medical Emergencies (5 CEU credits)

This course examines the technician's role in managing an emergency. It should enable the technician to prepare for an emergency before it is presented. Topics include how to decide whether a patient is in critical condition and correct monitoring procedures. Treatments and drugs are also discussed.
