Step 4: Magazines and Scientific Articles

To find articles and current research about your topic, use a journal index online at the Guelph Library website (see link below). A journal index is similar to the library catalogue. It searches a database where articles from magazines and journals are collected. **Look for the 'Get It' button or full-text link** to read articles online.
